I'm excited and encouraged by the way the community of Faith Mennonite High School has pulled together during these challenging times. As we move forward boldly with the task of Christian education, it is a blessing to see students, parents, and churches partner with our school's mission.

The mission of Faith Mennonite High School is for students to learn excellence in academic, Biblical, and vocational disciplines. How does this happen? What is required in order for FMH graduates to achieve success in these three areas? First and foremost, **academic excellence** is achieved through dedicated teachers who are passionate about teaching and learning. Teachers at FMH learn best teaching practices in order to reach every student according to their learning style and academic needs. When funds are available, our teachers participate in summer training at Faith Builders, complete college coursework, and attend bi-monthly professional development sessions. Their dedication to growing as teachers is a primary way that we reach every student.

Excellence in Biblical disciplines is achieved through a variety of ways: daily chapels (featuring some of *you* as speakers), Bible memory, Spiritual Life Week, Missions Week, and excellent curriculum and textbooks which are regularly reviewed for Biblical worldview integration. Each of these is enhanced by hiring qualified teachers who are passionate about the Gospel and the kingdom of God and who infuse their teaching with a Biblical worldview, whether in Music, Bible, English, Science, or History.

Excellence in vocational disciplines is achieved by offering high-quality electives that prepare students for the job force: Accounting, Computer Apps, Welding, Small Engines, Basic Electricity, Home Ec, Child Care, and Teachers 4 Tomorrow.

Over the past year, the FMH school board has completed an analysis of the strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities for growth at FMH. Currently, the school board is developing a multi-year improvement plan based on this analysis. Now more than ever, the church has a need for young people who are dedicated to Jesus Christ, who are trained by the Bible, who think carefully and critically, who write and speak graciously, and who are prepared to work with their hands and sing with their hearts. This vision is achieved through your financial investment. **Raising \$100,000 this year will allow us to finish the year well and position us to start strategically improving our school programs.**
